Halloween Costumes are in the stores, so it must be time for our Annual Costume rules:

Students are encouraged, but not required to dress up for the parade. The following guidelines should be followed when choosing a Halloween costume:

- ◆ Halloween costumes must be appropriate for an elementary school student. In other words, no gory costumes.
- ◆ NO weapons
- ◆ NO fake blood
- ◆ NO face make-up
- ◆ NO hair color
- ◆ NO props
- ◆ NO masks either regular masks or gory masks

This year the Halloween Parade for all students will be held at 8:50am on October 31st. Costumes should be large enough to be worn over their regular clothes. Students are allowed to wear their costumes to school. Costumes will be taken off after the parade for 1st-6th graders.

Parents and families are welcome to view the parade behind the boundaries.



Stand Tall, Molly Lou Melon

Molly Lou Melon is short and clumsy and has buckteeth and a voice that sounds like a bullfrog being squeezed by a boa constrictor. But armed with the encouraging words of her grandmother, Molly Lou confidently confronts the class bully at her new school. A not-to-be missed story for the less-than-perfect part of everyone!

Notice It! Name It! Celebrate It!

This month your student will hear a book titled Stand Tall, Molly Lou Melon in class as part of the ABC program. Please watch for a letter from your classroom parent volunteer(s) for more information about this lesson. The goals of this lesson for our students are to identify caring adults in their lives, develop their personal power and believe that they have control over their lives, and increase self-esteem. Here are some activities that you can do at home to help achieve these goals:

- **Boost Each Other Up:** Celebrate each family member's special talents and abilities. Go around the dinner table and have each family member say one thing they like about each of the other members.
- **Wall of Fame:** Create a special place in your house to display items that family members are proud of. Assign a space for each family member. Post items in this space that they are proud of (special drawings, an assignment they worked hard on, photos, etc.). Make sure there is a space for mom and dad, too!
- **Have your student "expert" explain the concept of "mud thoughts and clear thoughts" to the family. Have the family practice changing "mud thoughts into clear thoughts."**
